Serotonin Club Meeting Updates Montréal, Quebec Hôtel Omni Mont-Royal 9th – 11th, July 2010

Young investigator deadline extended to April 15th

Submissions must be received by April 15th 2010. Successful applicants will be informed shortly thereafter.

The NIH grant submitted to support the young investigators has received a very favorable score. If funded the Serotonin Club will provide approximately \$1500 to Young Investigators chosen to present as the fourth

speaker in one of the meeting's 12 symposia. Awards will be available to applicants who are pre-doctoral or no more than 3 years post-doctoral and will be competitive. Applicants are asked to submit (1) their meeting abstract, (2) a brief supporting letter from the applicant's training program director or department head to confirm the applicant's academic status and need for travel monies, (3) and the symposia from the meeting program that the candidate would like to be a participant to Shatich Rivers at Rivers@email.chop.edu. Awards will be competitive and judged on the overall merits of the applicant and the submitted abstract. The awards selection committee will be composed of officers of the Serotonin Club, members of the organizing committee and chairs of each symposium.

In addition, the Serotonin Club will also recognize the work of young researchers

through Outstanding Abstract Awards (\$700). The criteria for selection are academic status of the applicant (ie. students, post-doctoral fellows, junior researchers not more than three years past their postdoctoral period of training) and scientific merit of the abstract. The awards selection committee will be composed of officers of the Serotonin Club, members of the organizing committee and chairs of each symposium. Awardees will be formally recognized at the opening reception and dinner.

Incomplete applications will not be considered and will be returned. *Applicants must be members of the Serotonin Club. Instructions for joining the Serotonin Club are below and on the website at www.serotoninclub.org*
